2. Measures taken to complete the syllabus of courses and programs.	<p>Though the transition from offline classes to online during the academic year 2020-21 was rather drastic the faculty and students at Sree Narayana College, Punalur were able to navigate through the period quite successfully. Majority of the college teaching faculty underwent training before the start of online classes to learn about the various online platforms and other tools available for online teaching and so they were able to let students make their choice from a wide array of video conferencing platforms including Google Meet, Zoom, Microsoft Teams, Webex according to student's convenience. Various WhatsApp groups were started for each class so that announcements could reach students in a timely manner. Lecture notes and other materials were shared as pdf or document files via Google Classroom. In addition to notes, recorded video and audio lessons were also provided when needed especially during the initial days as some students expressed difficulty accessing live lessons. However, after the initial few months most students were able to procure mobile devices with sufficient data speed to attend live online sessions. Economically backward students who had expressed difficulty were either provided mobile phones or given financial assistance for the purchase of the same.</p> <p>At the institute level arrangements were made to take online classes efficiently including providing Wi-Fi access to all departments and arranging necessary rooms to take online classes. For teaching Mathematics pen tabs were used and all faculty members of Mathematics department purchased the necessary devices for this purpose. YouTube channels were also started by some faculty to aid slow learners. Time tables were fixed at the department level for online classes and weekly class reports with the platform used, topics covered and attendance were submitted to the head of the departments which were then forwarded to the Principal. Attendance was consolidated to assess student participation and students who were regularly absent were identified and remedial measures were taken to ensure reach to all students.</p> <p>In order to encourage active participation in live sessions teachers used apps like mentimeter, whiteboard, etc . Google forms and Certify'em app were also used to gauge student learning levels regularly and provide feedback. Focus was placed on visual learning and so videos and graphical representations were frequently used in classes. Students were also given regular assignments and tests and the feedback was communicated directly via one-on-one online sessions. Students were also encouraged to record the sessions if they found the topic to be challenging so that they could learn at their own pace.</p> <p>At the end of the semester an internal assessment was held online. The results of these tests were also shared with parents through online PTA meetings. These sessions were very helpful to identify the various challenges students faced and provided a platform for feedback. Before end semester university level examinations, a feedback was collected from students to assess portion completion and difficult areas that would require remedial classes. Revision classes were held according to student response.</p>
